While at the ATM drivethrough, a woman straddled both lanes in a two-lane isle. I've been there a thousand times and not one person l've ever seen straddled these lanes, they just pick one. Sometimes the line moves quickly, other times you have to wait while the cars next to you move right through. It's a gamble, but we make a decision and we accept it.

Maybe it was the long day or maybe I just felt short-tempered, but while the woman straddled the lanes, I went around her car, and I picked the left lane. She got out of her vehicle and told me; "I've been waiting, you can't go around me." I explained the unwritten policy of the drivethrough ATM machine. She angrily got back into her car and waited again. As I drove up to the machine, I felt so uncomfortable. I knew she never should've sat there and straddled both lanes, but who am I to react to her misdirection? The uncomfortable feeling made me sick inside, I knew that I never should've gone around her. So I backed up, allowed her to go first, calling out to her; "I'm sorry, go ahead of me." She pulled up to the machine, finished her transaction, and her last words were; "Thank you for being fair."

I believe the true essence of being a complete individual begins with the ability to communicate. The ability to express yourself and present issues, views, and concerns in a dignified, fair, and an understandable manner. To simply be a simple person.

Simple people do not get caught up in the unfairness in life. They do not listen with

Instead, I almost ruined her entire day, and who knows what that could've done to her family and friends.

We need to understand the true meaning of sharing experiences, applying yourself, being honest, open and sincere. It will bring you peace when you remember that you have so much to contribute to life, let's not waste it on bitterness, anger, frustration, or unfairness. Instead, let's focus on the good things.

The power we hold within ourselves is worthless when we misdirect our hearts by allowing our minds to take over. I believe the truest form of life is not just having the power to get your way, but having the power to help others find their way. light at the end of life's tunnel. This article was written by Michael Armijo before he passed placed in his memory.



Once complete, this project will reduce congestion and emissions, and it will increase product movement and multimodal connectivity, according to the City. "We can't wait to see what an excellent addition this will make to our community!"

Also expected to come is the new Olive Garden at the Station in the Goodman Commerce Center. They just put their new sign up! An opening date should be announced soon.

Other exciting news is that the City of Eastvale is one of the first cities in California to integrate Solar APP+ into its City services. "Solar APP+ is an automated solar and storage systems permit portal," stated a City news release. "It stream-

lines and automates permit reviews, allowing solar permits to be approved within the day. This will lower costs and expedite solar installations, encouraging property owners to invest in generating renewable and sustainable energy." Visit the City website to submit a solar permit.





always will be our mission. Driving under the influence is dangerous and puts a further strain on critical resources.

The Riverside Countu Sheriff's Office reminds the public that impaired driving is not just from alcohol. Some prescription medications or over-thecounter drugs may interfere with driving.

Always follow directions for use and read warning labels about "driving" or "operating heavy machinery," which includes driving a vehicle. While medicinal and recreational marijuana are legal, driving under the influence of marijuana is illegal.

If you plan on drinking or taking medications that may impact your ability to drive safely, plan on staying at home.

Drivers charged with DUI face an average of \$13,500 in fines and penalties, as well as a suspended license.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the Riverside County Sheriff's Office by a arant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver - Call 9-1-1'.

Inner Peace

An early morning meeting is always a challenge. I thought I would be on time until I was stuck in traffic because of a standing train in the intersection. Many people made U-turns. But I figured that even if I take another route, I would be late anyway. I decided it is time to exercise patience. It was not easy, when I watched the clock on the dashboard keep ticking while the train sat still. I started to have inner conflicts. Should I follow the others? Was it really a good decision just waiting? Perhaps it might be your story too. We experience this kind of annoying inconvenience very often. We may conclude that we are unlucky or may blame ourselves for picking the wrong route or not responding quicker.

In the Letter to the Philippians, Apostle Paul was in a similar situation. He planned to go to Rome to witness in front of the emperor. He had many plans to preach the Gospel somewhere. Instead, he was stuck in prison not knowing whether he would survive the trial.

Yes, we would be patient to endure all these troubles. But what about when we see our loved one get stuck in a situation, we could not do anything to help. I think you may agree that it is more painful to see them suffer than we suffer ourselves. For the brothers and sisters in the Church of Philippi, this was the case: their messenger Epaphroditus was very sick while visiting Paul. Their beloved apostle was in prison with the possibility of facing execution. You can imagine their feelings.

But this is what Paul said in his letter:

6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7

I did arrive late for the meeting. I also struggle with the painful situations of my loved ones, sickness, trouble etc. Prayer may not be answered in a way we expected. Things could turn out to be even more difficult. But it is through trouble and suffering that God makes us experience the great gift He prepares for us – inner peace.

Psalm 27:3, "Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war arise against me, yet I will be confident."

Jonathan suggested to his armor bearer that they go up after the enemy (1 Samuel 14). The enemy struck fear in the people and took most of their weapons, but Jonathan was not afraid of the enemy. Jonathan knew "the Lord would work for them" (1 Sam 14:6). He knew God was on their side. While Saul and his army hid in fear, Jonathan began to move in faith. Jonathan said to his armor bearer, "if the enemy says 'we will come down to you,' we will stand ground. But if the enemy says 'come on up' then God has delivered them into our hand" (1 Sam 14:8-10). The Philistines call down to Jonathan and his armor bearer telling them to come up. When they climbed to the top of the mountain they began to fight and defeat the enemy. As the Philistines were being defeated, they couldn't believe they were being defeated by two young men. It's because God went before them and even caused the ground to shake. Confidence is trust in God and trusting His ability to deliver you, to heal, to save, or provide. Confidence is having the faith that the LORD will do everything He has promised.
