ERHS Teacher Arrested

Eastvale - On November 16, a former Eleanor Roosevelt High School (ERHS) teacher was arrested for allegations of inappropriate contact with students while employed.

In April 2023, investigators with the Riverside County Sheriff's Office, Special Victims Unit received a report that a teacher was allegedly having inappropriate contact

with students. The teacher was identified as Chad Costello, 44-year-old resident of Anaheim. Costello was hired in August 2021 as the ERHS Theater teacher but was placed on administrative leave in April 2023 when the allegations came to light.

During the investigation, it was determined that Costello had inappropriate contact with students and he was arrested by investigators on November 16 in the city of Anaheim. He

was booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center for child annoyance and sexual battery. According to Riverside County jail records, he is being charged with two felony counts of sexual battery, four misdemeanor counts of sexual battery for purposes of arousal, and four counts of misdemeanor annoying or molesting a child. He is being held on \$75,000 bail.

Crime Recap

Eastvale- In the last month, there were several crime incidents in Eastvale and the surrounding areas. The information below is courtesy of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department.

Incident: Commercial Burglary Suspects Arrested

Date: October 17, 2023 Location: Eastvale

Details: On September 9, 2023, about 2:52 p.m., deputies from the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station responded to reports of multiple burglaries at a commercial storage business in the 6300 block of Archibald Avenue, Eastvale. Multiple suspects forced entry into numerous storage units inside of the commercial business. The suspects stole several high-value items totaling over \$30,000.00 and fled the area. The Eastvale Special Enforcement Team assumed the investigation.

These items were recovered from a "jugging" burglary.

During the investigation, deputies were able to identify four of the suspects involved. On October 17, 2023, deputies located one of the suspects, 45-year-old Antoinette Ropke of Menifee, who was arrested and booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center. On October 22, 2023, a second suspect, 35-year-old Jamie Capul of Chino, was identified and apprehended. Through various investigative means, deputies authored a search





It was only a 45-minute drive, but I arrived at the site. It took me another 10 minutes to find his "section," but we were soon in the vicinity of where his life was laid to rest. As I paced each headstone, I had an eerie vision of him lying beneath the surface, watching me pace the yard, while his spirit yearned for me, almost as though he was screaming, in a silent fortitude: "I'm over here."

I walked up to his plaque,

and I stared at the impression in the stone. I reluctantly read the words, "Cipriano Armijo, beloved man of God." I traced each word with my hand, etching each letter with my fingers. I knelt down on the delicate, damp, green grass; I relaxed myself over the 8 by 4 foot section of landscape that was the last home to his physical existence.

When I knelt, I looked down and confessed all the things that have happened since he left this earth. I explained to the ground, and the bronze piece of metal that bore his name, my life without daddy, hoping his spirit heard my deepest fears and my strongest accomplishments. I told him that I had hoped he was proud of me, as my life had followed strange paths that have given me journeys of learning, and routines of pain. Since his departure, life had become interesting, painful, and victorious.

When I knelt at his site, I

gazed upon the freshly cut, softened soil, and then I held myself accountable of my actions and assessments of life, just as when he was alive. I relayed the message; "I know you're there, I know you're watching." And when I sat at his gravesite, I remembered all those who claim their parents are no longer with us. While on my knees, I realized that I still had a father; I still had someone to answer to.

I believe that parents are forever. I believe that we never end our influence on our children; we never stop being parents. That's why it's so important that we do a good job when we're here on earth; we have no guarantee of how long we're going to stay. We must do the best we can with what little time we have. Our children

need us now, and they'll need us when we're gone.

And when we're gone, when our heart stops and our spirit rises to the world beyond our moral character, we can only hope that we've loved enough, lived enough, and laughed enough for our children to remember our lives as a benefit to their own. And when they someday kneel on the delicate, damp, green grass that lies the last home to our physical existence, we can only hope the tears that fill their eyes and hearts are tears of love that yearns for our spirit to forever watch over their joyous lives; to remind them, that we'll never, ever, stop being their parents.



warrant, which was served at a commercial storage business located in the 13000 block of Ramona Avenue, Chino, where multiple personal items stolen during the original thefts were recovered. The two remaining suspects have been identified and apprehension efforts are ongoing.

Incident: "Jugging" Burglary Results in Arrests

Date: October 26, 2023 Location: Norco

Details: On October 26, 2023, at 10:02 a.m., Norco Sheriff's Station deputies responded to a vehicle burglary near the 100 block of Hidden Valley Parkway in Norco. Upon their arrival, they learned that the victim had withdrawn a large amount of money and placed it inside the glove box of their vehicle before returning to the location.

While the victim was inside, a citizen observed a subject walk up to the victim's vehicle, break a window, and climb inside. A getaway vehicle approached the victim's vehicle and drove away once the vehicle burglar stole the victim's money. The mode of operation in these thefts is commonly referred to

as "jugging." Investigative leads on the whereabouts of the suspect's vehicle led deputies to the Cabazon area, where Cabazon Sheriff's Station deputies located and detained the occupants. Norco deputies responded and recovered most of the victim's stolen money and evidence of the crime. The suspects, 34-year-old Isaiah Fitzgerald

Moses and 33-year-old Denzel Tyrell Lawson, residents of Houston, Texas, were arrested and booked at the Robert Presley Detention Center for burglary and conspiracy, with bail set at \$10,000.

Incident: Armed Robbery Date: October 23, 2023 Location: Jurupa Valley


Details: On Monday, October 23, 2023, at 07:15 a.m., deputies from the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station responded to a business in the 10000 block of Bellegrave Avenue, in the city of Jurupa Valley, regarding an armed robbery. The victim advised three unknown males brandished a handgun and took cash and tobacco products. The suspects fled the scene in a black Jeep. Jurupa Valley Station investigators responded to the scene and assumed the investigation. One of the suspects was identified and located at a residence in the 2700 Block of Eagle Creek Place in the city of Ontario. A short time later, deputies conducted a high-risk enforcement stop on the suspect vehicle as it left the residence, and the occupants were detained without incident. Investigators served a search warrant at the Eagle Creek Place residence and located two additional suspects. As a result of the search warrant, investigators recovered stolen cash, tobacco products,

and four firearms.

Investigators arrested Tommy Rojas, an 18-year-old resident of Rancho Cucamonga, Umar Syed, a 19-yearold resident of Pomona, and a 17-year-old male juvenile for robbery, conspiracy, and weapons charges. Rojas and Syed were booked into Robert Presley Detention Center, and the juvenile was booked into Riverside Juvenile Hall. This investigation is ongoing.



Planning

The year 2024 is right around the corner. Once we step into the month of November, it is time for planning. I am sure many are already deep into their planning process. It is exciting to set sight on new horizons and set forth new goals to pursue. And of course, you would not mind putting your much-anticipated concert and your dream vacation on the plan too.

With all these excitements and anticipations. let us admit that life is unpredictable. Do we forget about the sudden and unforeseeable arrival of the COVID-19 pandemic, which disrupted our lives like never before? It set back our plan by several years. Now, if we carefully read the news, do you see that war is looming on the horizon, inflation is turning back, recession is just waiting to step in? Any of these could blow away our plan easily. So, is it still possible to make plan for 2024?

There is a profound truth we can learn from Proverbs 16:1: "To humans belong the plans of the heart, but from the LORD comes the proper answer of the tongue."

Also in the New Testament, James 4:13-15 provides further insight about planning and tomorrow: "Now listen, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money.' 

This is an ongoing investigation, and no further details were provided by the Sheriff's Department. Anyone with information regarding this case is encouraged to call Investigator J. Andrade at (951) 955-1701.

The Corona-Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) addressed the issue stating that once they were informed of the allegations, the teacher never returned to the classroom, was immediately placed on administrative leave, and the Riverside County Sheriff's Department was contacted. The Press Enterprise reported that CNUSD issued the following statement:


"This news is disheartening and upsetting to us all. Corona-Norco Unified School District has zero tolerance for any behavior that endangers our students. To reinforce our commitment, the school district is expanding our comprehensive training programs focused on preventing and addressing matters of this nature. These initiatives aim to educate staff, students, and parents about the various aspects of respectful behavior and reporting procedures."

The expansion of their training programs may benefit greatly because this is not the first time an ERHS teacher has been arrested for inappropriate behavior with students. Just last year, ERHS teacher, Amanda Quinonez, was accused of committing lewd acts with a male student and distributing explicit photos of a sexual nature to him. Another teacher was arrested prior to that as well.










