Eastvale Gets Its Own ZIP Code

STAFF REPORTS

Eastvale – After months of advocacy, the City of Eastvale will now have its own ZIP code! The "United State Postal Service has revised the 92880 ZIP code to accurately register as Eastvale, California starting January 1, 2024," according to a City news release.

"This change not only reflects the growth and vibrancy of our community but also ensures that our residents receive the attention and service they deserve," stated Councilman Todd Rigby when he was Mayor of Eastvale. "This redes-

ignation is a testament to the collaborative efforts of our residents, businesses, and local, state, and federal government. As a city, we are proud of this significant milestone and appreciate everyone that made this possible," said Rigby.

Congresswoman Norma Torres shared her excitement in a news release, "When we work together on behalf of Inland Empire families, we can get great things done. When I first began representing Eastvale in Congress earlier this year, I constantly heard from my new constituents about the numerous problems posed by the

lack of an accurate zip code for the city. With proper recognition under the 92880 zip code, confusion will be reduced for families, seniors and small businesses. I thank Congressman Calvert and Senator Padilla for partnering with me to secure this change and deliver results for our constituents," said Congresswoman Torres.

"I have been working jointly with the city of Eastvale and my colleagues in Congress to advocate for overdue changes in the way the US Postal Service identifies Eastvale and its Zip Codes," stated Congressman Ken Calvert. "The approval of

the last line change in addresses, which will now identify Eastvale as the preferred last line city for the 92880 Zip Code, is a positive step forward for city residents and businesses. I will continue to work with the city and my colleagues to address outstanding Zip Code issues impacting the city," said Congressman Calvert.

A City news release stated: "The city will remain home to ZIP codes 92880 and 91752, but legislation H.R. 696 and H.R. 860 were introduced in

the hours of 7:00 PM and 3:00
AM. The checkpoint yielded
the following results:

- •1,061 vehicles screened.
- •5 Field Sobriety Tests (FSTs) conducted.
- •2 arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.

- •1 arrested for a miscellaneous misdemeanor.
- •4 arrested for driving with a suspended driver's license.
- •19 citations issued for driving without a driver's license.•6 vehicles were stored.

DUI checkpoint locations are determined based on reported incidents of impaired driving-related crashes. The primary purpose of DUI checkpoints is to promote public safety by taking suspected impaired drivers off roads.

Funding for this checkpoint was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

DUI checkpoint locations are determined based on data showing incidents of impaired driving-related crashes. The primary purpose of DUI checkpoints are to promote public



Grant Awarded To Increase Safety On Roads

Staff Reports

Eastvale - The Riverside County Sheriff's Office for the Jurupa Valley Station was awarded a \$125,173 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS). "The grant will support our ongoing enforcement and education programs to help reduce the number of serious injuries and deaths on our roads," stated the Riverside County Sheriff's Department in a news release.

"This funding will strengthen our commitment to public safety in our community," Sergeant Robles said. "We will be able to increase our efforts in making our roads safer for everyone and focus on critical areas such as distracted driving, impaired driving and

The news release stated that the grant will provide additional programs and resources, includ-

- · DUI checkpoints and patrols focused on stopping suspected impaired drivers.
- · High-visibility distracted driving enforcement operations targeting drivers in violation of California's hands-free cell phone law.
- · Enforcement operations focused on the most dangerous driver behaviors that put the safety of people biking or walking at risk.
 - Enforcement operations fo-

cused on top violations that cause crashes: speeding, failure to yield, stop sign and/or red-light running, and improper turning or lane changes.

- · Community presentations on traffic safety issues such as distracted driving, impaired driving, speeding and bicycle and pedestrian safety.
- Collaborative enforcement efforts with neighboring agen-

· Officer training and/or recertification: Standard Field Sobriety Test (SFST), Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) and Drug Recognition Expert (DRE).

The grant program will run through September 2024.

Celebrate Responsibly with a "Go Safely" Game Plan

Eastvale - The holiday season can be a dangerous time for people on the roads. In December 2021 alone, 1,013 people were killed in the U.S. in alcohol-impaired-driving crashes according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The Riverside County Sheriff's Office wants to remind the public of the dangers of driving impaired and celebrate the holiday season responsibly by not driving under the influence.

From Dec. 13 through New Year's Day, The Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station will have additional deputies on patrol looking for driv-

ers suspected of being under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. The high-visibility enforcement effort is part of a national campaign, Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over, with the goal of stopping suspected impaired drivers who put others on the road at risk.

"Impaired driving isn't just dangerous, it's illegal," Deputy Richard Comstock said. "Let's make this a joyful and safe holiday season for everyone on the road. This enforcement period allows us to get the message out that it is essential to act responsibly and plan a sober ride home."

The Riverside County Sheriff's Office encourages everyone to stay in for the night or have a "go

safely" game plan by scheduling a ride or designating a sober driver if you plan to consume alcohol.

Impaired driving is not just from alcohol. Marijuana, prescription medications or over-the-counter drugs may also impair. Do your research and understand how certain drugs may affect your driving

safety by taking suspected impaired drivers off the road.

"Impaired drivers put others on the road at significant risk," Sergeant Ignacio Robles said. "Any prevention measures that reduce the number of impaired drivers on our roads significantly improves traffic safety."

The Riverside County Sheriff's Office, Jurupa Valley Station reminds the public that impaired driving is not just from alcohol. Some prescription medications and over-thecounter drugs may interfere with driving. While medicinal and recreational marijuana are legal, driving under the influence of marijuana is illegal.

Drivers charged with a first-time DUI face an average of \$13,500 in fines and penalties, as well as a suspended license.

Incident:Robbery Suspects Arrested

Date: November 21, 2023 Location: Eastvale

Details: On November 21, 2023, about 9:25 p.m., deputies from the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station responded to a business, located in the 12000 block of Limonite Avenue, Eastvale regarding a robbery that occurred at a local grocery

Upon arrival, deputies learned the suspect approached an employee inside the location and stole an undisclosed amount of money. The suspect fled from the store to an awaiting white 4-door Volkswagen,

which was occupied by another subject.

Deputies, with the assistance of the Riverside County Sheriff's Aviation Unit, immediately conducted an extensive search for the suspect vehicle. The vehicle was located in the 6000 block of Fa irlane Avenue, Eastvale and two subjects believed to be involved in the robbery were located at a residence.

Sheriff's Investigators responded to the scene and assumed the investigation. A search warrant was served at a residence and evidence of the crime,

including the majority of the stolen money, was recovered. Investigators conducted multiple interviews, recovered additional evidence during this investigation, and ultimately arrested Charles Sanford, Jr., a 27 year-old resident of Rialto, and Elijah Tucker, a 26 yearold resident of San Bernardino for robbery and conspiracy. They were both booked into the Robert Presley Detention

Congress earlier this year and hope to mitigate the issue. In the meantime, our legislators and the City will celebrate this step in the right direction."


