Eastvale Walmart Breaks Ground

Eastvale - Walmart and Eastvale city officials recently broke ground for an expected 170,995 sq. ft. Walmart Supercenter coming in Spring 2025.

The Walmart Supercenter will be located at 14100 Limonite Avenue and will include a 16-pump fuel station. It is also expected to create around 300 new jobs for Eastvale and its surrounding areas.

The numbers are also likely underreported because law enforcement officers may not always be able to tell that distraction was a factor in a crash."





While at the ATM drive-through, a woman straddled both lanes in a two-lane isle. I've been there a thousand times and not one person has ever straddled these lanes, they just pick one. Sometimes the line moves quickly, other times you have to wait while the cars next to you move right through. It's a gamble, but we make a decision and we accept it.

Maybe it was the long day or maybe I just felt short-tempered, but while the woman straddled the lanes, I went around her car, and I picked the left lane. She got out of her vehicle and told me; "I've been waiting, you can't go around me." I explained the unwritten policy of the drivethrough ATM machine. She

angrily got back into her car and waited again. As I drove up to the machine, I felt so uncomfortable. I knew she never should've sat there and straddled both lanes, but who am I to react to her misdirection? The uncomfortable feeling made me sick inside, I knew that I never should've gone around her. So I backed up, allowed her to go first, calling out to her; "I'm sorry, go ahead of me." She pulled up to the machine, finished her transaction, and her last words were; "Thank you for being fair."

I believe the true essence of being a complete individual begins with the ability to communicate. The ability to express yourself and present issues, views, and concerns in a dignified, fair, and an understandable manner. To simply be a human being.

Simple people do not get caught up in the unfairness in life. They do not listen with anger and respond with vengeance. They see light and are drawn to it. They're clear individuals that can respond with solutions and not just complain. They respond instead of react. And it's their simplicity that keeps them humble and dignified. Simple people see or experience tragedy and work

When I pulled in front of the woman at the ATM machine, I knew she was misdirected, and yet I reacted to her misdirection instead of responding to it. If it meant that much to me to not wait behind someone who couldn't make a decision, I should've communicated with her. And if it didn't mean that much to me, then I just should've waited behind her and not given it another thought. Instead, I almost ruined her entire day, and who knows what that could've done to her family and friends.

I believe that we, as a society, need to remember how important and how powerful we really are. We need to understand the true meaning of sharing experiences, applying yourself, being honest, open, and sincere. It will bring you peace when you remember that you have so much to contribute to life, let's not waste it on bitterness, anger, frustration, or unfairness. Instead, let's focus on the good things.

The power we hold within ourselves is worthless when we misdirect our hearts by allowing our minds to take over. I believe the truest form of life is not just having the power to get your way, but having the power to help others find their way. And when we see this powerful light that shines from within, we can capture it and allow those rays of sunshine to help our heart glow with a magnificent gleam that reminds us that there really is a light at the end of the tunnel.



mind that the current law states "drivers are not allowed to hold a phone or electronic communications device while operating a vehicle, even when stopped at

a red light. This includes talking, texting or using an app. Using a handheld cell phone while driving is punishable by a fine and violating the hands-free law for a second time within 36 months of a prior conviction for the same offense will result in a point being added to a driver's record."

The news release stated that "if you have an important phone call, text or email, or are in a situation with other distractions, such as looking up directions, pull over to a safe parking spot to complete the task without putting yourself and others at risk. Other distractions can be

eating, grooming, reaching for something that fell on the floor, putting on or taking off clothing, talking with passengers, or children in the back seat."

"A driver's focus should be on the road, not their phone," Sergeant Rafael Lopez said. "That text, phone call, email or social media post is not worth the risk to yourself and other people on the road."

Funding for distracted driving enforcement is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Details: On Thursday, April 4, 2024, at 3:20 p.m., a Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station school resource deputy assigned to a middle school in the 8000 block of Galena Avenue, Jurupa Valley, received a report of criminal threats made by a 12-year-old student towards his classmates. With the assistance of the Jurupa Valley Station Investigations Bureau and Jurupa Valley Special Enforcement Team, a thorough investigation of these criminal threats was immediately initiated. Deputies and investigators responded to a residence in the 5000 of Baldwin Avenue, Jurupa Valley. As a result of the investigation, three unsecured assault rifles, one handgun, and several hundred rounds of ammunition were located within the residence and seized as evidence.

Rolando Sida Sr., a 42-year-old resident of Jurupa Valley, was arrested and booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center for possession of assault weapons, unsecured firearms accessible to minors, and child endangerment. The 12-year-old juvenile was also arrested and booked for criminal threats. This is an ongoing investigation, and no additional information will be released at this time.

Stand In Faith

"Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong...." 1 Corinthians 16:13

This is the final encouragement to a church from the Apostle Paul. Paul planted the Corinthian church, but the church had issues that needed addressing. The final comments to them is a calling to "stand fast." This is actually a military term meaning to "hold your position" or "to refuse to be defeated." There is to be no retreat. Paul is encouraging the Corinthian church to remain strong in the faith because

opposition will come. Trials will ensue. Are you going through a time of drought? Are you going through a time of discouragement? Paul says, "stand firm and be brave." I believe we need to share this encouragement all the more today. I am reminded how "Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore, he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself." This Scripture says God had brought Daniel into the favor and goodwill of the chief

of the eunuchs (Daniel 1:8-9). Under Babylonian rule, Daniel turned his back on the luxuries of the king's court because eating defiled food would have been a compromise of his faith. God honored Daniel's stand and he earned the respect of the chief of the eunuchs, because Daniel's courage impressed him. Daniel stood for God and was strong. He didn't seek man's approval, but God's will. If we allow ourselves to be dissuaded from doing anything unless we have complete approval, it almost assured we will never accomplish anything

of value. Instead of being discouraged by opposition, we should take comfort in (God's faithfulness) and keep on doing what is right. Whatever you find yourself up against today, remember that "one," with God, is the majority. "If God is for "you" who can stand against you (Romans 8:31). He sees what you don't see. Faith is trusting and believing God. God does the impossible (Matthew 19:26).

The First Bible

I was a senior at Saguaro High School in Scottsdale, Arizona when I was looking around a local book store. A younger student I knew came in with several girlfriends. Her name was Gena. She wanted to buy a Bible for herself.

She asked me what version of the Bible I would suggest. Don't misunderstand – there is only one Bible. But there are a number of different versions and translations. The King James Bible was popular in the 1960's but it was rather difficult to understand because it was written in English that was spoken in the 1600's. There were

more recent translations like the Revised Standard Version and the American Standard Version. One of the more modern versions at that time was the Phillips Bible. It was easier to read and helpful for people who had not read the Bible very much. She seemed to like that one.

After she left with her friends I bought a copy of the Phillips version and gave it to her at school a few days later. She was very surprised and very thankful for this simple gift. I have seen Gena and her husband Larry a number of times over the following decades. They became influential leaders in the Young Life ministry and several local

churches in Scottsdale. Every time I saw them she thanked me for the Bible I bought for her when she was a freshman at Saguaro High.

I wonder if you own a Bible. I wonder if you have ever read the Bible. It is the bestselling book in history. Many people have never read the Bible for themselves. It seems so big and intimidating. But I remind them it is a library of 66 books. Don't try to read it from front to back. I suggest they select one book in the table of contents and read one chapter-a-day. If you follow this plan you can read the whole Bible in three years. I always recommend starting in the book of Mark since that is my name.

If you simply read one chapter each day you will read the book of Mark in half a month. Put a check mark in the table of contents to remind you what you have read. Then select another book like John or Acts. Slow and steady – one chapter-a-day and one book at a time. Try a book from the Old Testament like Genesis and Exodus.

There is a passage in the Bible that says, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:105). The Bible is God's word written for us to read and follow. Let me encourage you to find a Bible and read a chapter-a-day. You will be glad you did and I will too!

4) Ask if you could run an errand for us.

5) Bring us a cup of coffee, or offer a meal, send pizza.

6) Take a moment and get to know our kids. They are amazing






